Medicines- A polite reminder that school policy follows the advice from the DfE Medicines administration guidance. If your child is prescribed a course of medication to be taken 3 times a day that this should be timetabled around school times—morning, straight after school and bedtime. If your child needs medication 4 times a day then staff can administer this but it is the parent's responsibility to ensure the medicine is brought to school and collected each day. All medicines should be in the original box and with the prescription label on it with the child's name clearly visible.

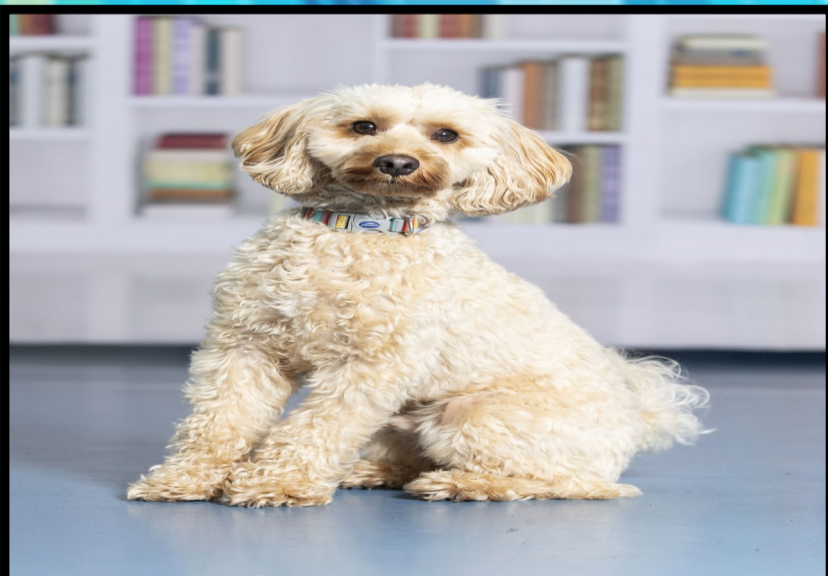

How many times can you step in and step out of a circle in 60 seconds?



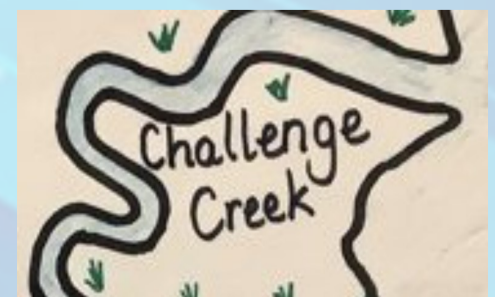
You must step in and out of the circle, one foot at a time. Both feet must step into the circle and then out again. No jumping!
