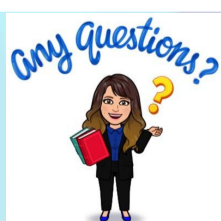


Reminders and Dates for the diary ...

- 22nd April - school back open

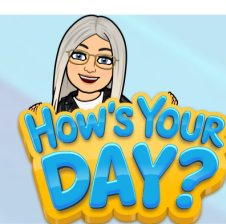
