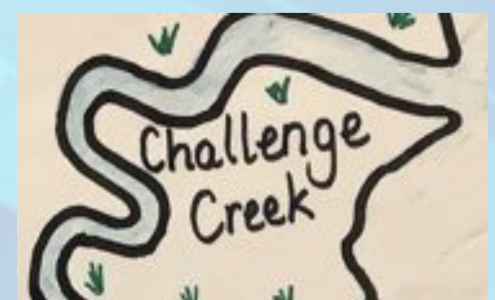
You must step in and out of the
