How many times can you step in and step out of a circle in 60 seconds?



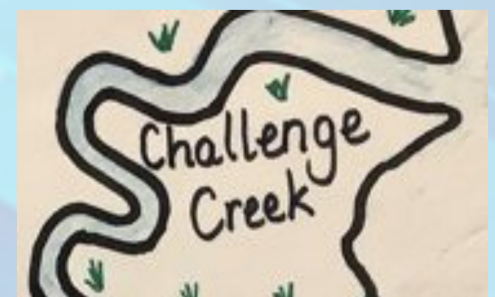
You must step in and out of the circle, one foot at a time. Both feet must step into the circle and then out again. No jumping!
