Please see the dojo calendar that Miss Potter has made for the next two months with key dates on them. Reminder that children need water bottles at school in this very hot weather.

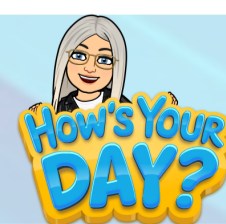
