Next week is half term. School will return on the 2nd June.

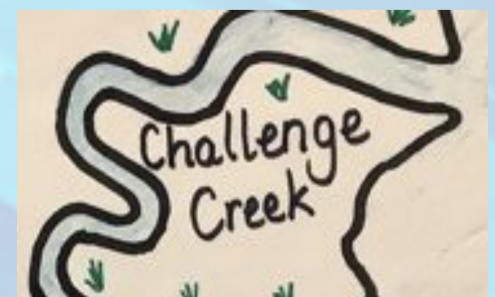

Challenge Creek

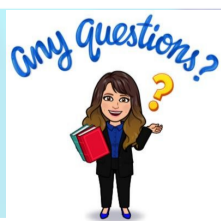
