Please do be mindful that at the start of the day when the children are entering the classroom, this may not be the best time for a chat as the staff will be focussed on welcoming the children into the classroom and starting the register and learning straight away. Likewise the end of the day when the children are leaving the classroom this may not be the best time as staff are focussed on ensuring the children leave the school safely. The best way is to send a dojo to your class teacher asking for a phone call or time for a chat so the focus is on you. Be mindful that the staff have playtime duties and at lunchtime may have meetings or are setting up for the afternoon learning, so the response may not be immediate. Finally to maintain a work life balance and to ensure staff have undisrupted family time, staff are advised not to look at dojos outside of their working hours, so they might not see or respond to your dojo till the next day.

It is always so lovely to see everyone coming through the gates in a morning, we have seen an improvement on children arriving for the 8.45am learning start. Please be reminded that learning starts at 8.45am and not 9am. The pastoral staff, attendance officer and SLT are the main gate staff. If you wish to see any of these staff please feel free to approach them on the gate for a chat or to arrange a meeting.
