I have recently been in touch with a number of people including Sharley Park Leisure to discuss the barriers that families have in accessing swimming opportunities for their children. The biggest reason from speaking to families is the cost of the swimming session. I have asked several agencies and providers if they would consider reducing the cost of swimming for families in the future. This year school have seen the largest number of non-swimmers, in the year group that is timetabled for a short swimming session through school. As a school we would love to offer more time to swimming but many reason stops schools from doing this, hence the importance that children get the experience to learn to swim outside of school.
