Hi All,

Well the sun is shining but it is crisp out there. As school is aware that finances can be very stretched at Christmas time, we do provide a variety of activities that have absolutely no charge, for example singing round the tree evening with a live brass band and refreshments, a Christmas turkey dinner for every child, the festive concerts for all year groups, school also provides a free gift from Santa and the Christmas Karaoke Disco. A selection box is also provided for every child. But I have to say the best school treat that we carry out every year is the visiting Pantomime group who set up a full pantomime experience in the hall for KS1 and EYFS in the morning and KS2 in the afternoon. The cost of this in a theatre is in excess of £25 for each child so this is a lovely treat for the children. All of these treats are provided through the school budget so that children can have a wonderful Christmas experience. I would suggest sharing the free events with your child when choosing the ones that have a cost to them to help reduce the overall cost.

Whilst we are on the school budget— schools has recently purchased two first aid walls. These are specific first aid kits for specific medical needs that are easily accessed on the wall at both ends of the school. School has also purchased equipment that can help in an instance of adult or child choking. We currently have two defibs in school but we will be looking to replace one in the next year, as we have had it in school for a few years now. We are always looking at having other medical equipment in school as most of our staff are trained to a basic or paediatric standard. This is where a big thank you goes out to parents because without your support for the events above the purchase of these items would be very difficult.
