This has been a long, frustrating and at times infuriating journey that took 4 years of coordinating and pushing with DCC and, since the summer when the work began, many emails and time spent trying to get answers. However I have now been given May as a time for completion and I have had confirmation that the steels have now been ordered. This project has been littered with barriers from outside agencies but I am hopeful that the end is in sight.

Next week I will be out of school for the majority of the week due to attending the Lea Green residential with some of our Year 4 children and a number of staff. Similar to when I went to Whitehall, Mrs French and the SLT team will be holding the fort in my absence.

We have a number of fantastic events coming up over the next 4 weeks until Easter so make sure you keep and eye on dojo.
