Hi All,

I really do not know where this week has gone. Every now and again we have what seems like a super speedy week and this has been one on them. There were many barriers for school along the way which represented a huge problem for the size of our school. However, through lots of phone calls and emails Tesco's were able to work with school to create an opportunity for a large number of schools like ours, overcoming the barriers that a large school brings. Last year 500 schools were able to benefit from the work our school did with Tesco and next year they will be rolling it out to 1000 schools. I have to say it was really exciting to go in areas that are not accessible to the public and the security was crazy. I was hoping to borrow a toilet roll to bring back to school but don't think I would get away with it. We are proud of the work we have done and that we are able to offer a wide variety of fruits and vegetables to our KS2 children.

A big well done to all our children on our 3 transition days- you had the most amazing time. Also a big whoo hoo to our 'pretend Year 7's' on their transition days at their new secondary schools.

Next week is action packed with water warriors, the summer fayre, the colour run and more. We have however seen a reduction in interest on parent pay this year and I will investigate if this is a financial issue or if we need to change the events that we offer. Maybe some events have run their course, and we need to stop them? This would be a shame as SP have always had such a great reputation for fun events but if they are not of interest anymore then we can explore different things or stop them altogether. The energy that goes into these events from staff could be used in different ways so we will look at this in September, unless interest increases. At SP we are always looking to evolve.

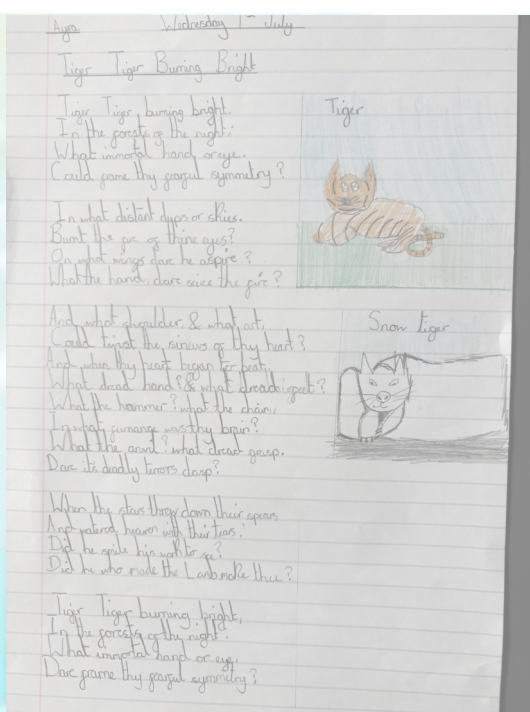

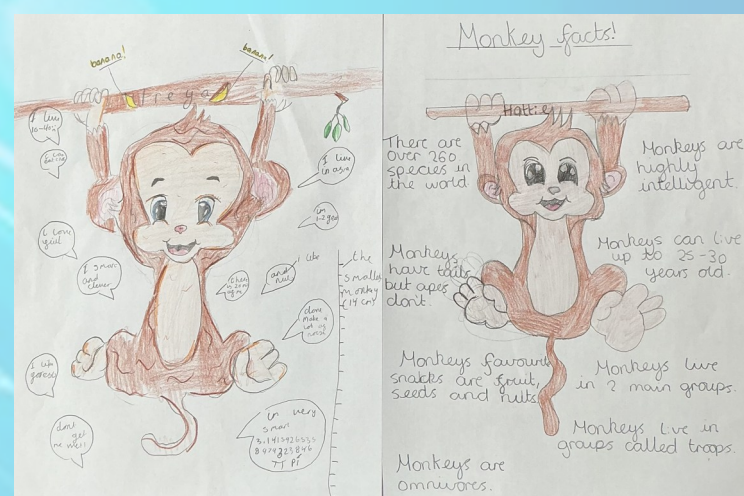

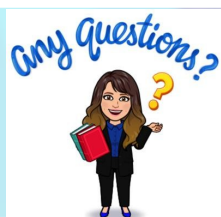
